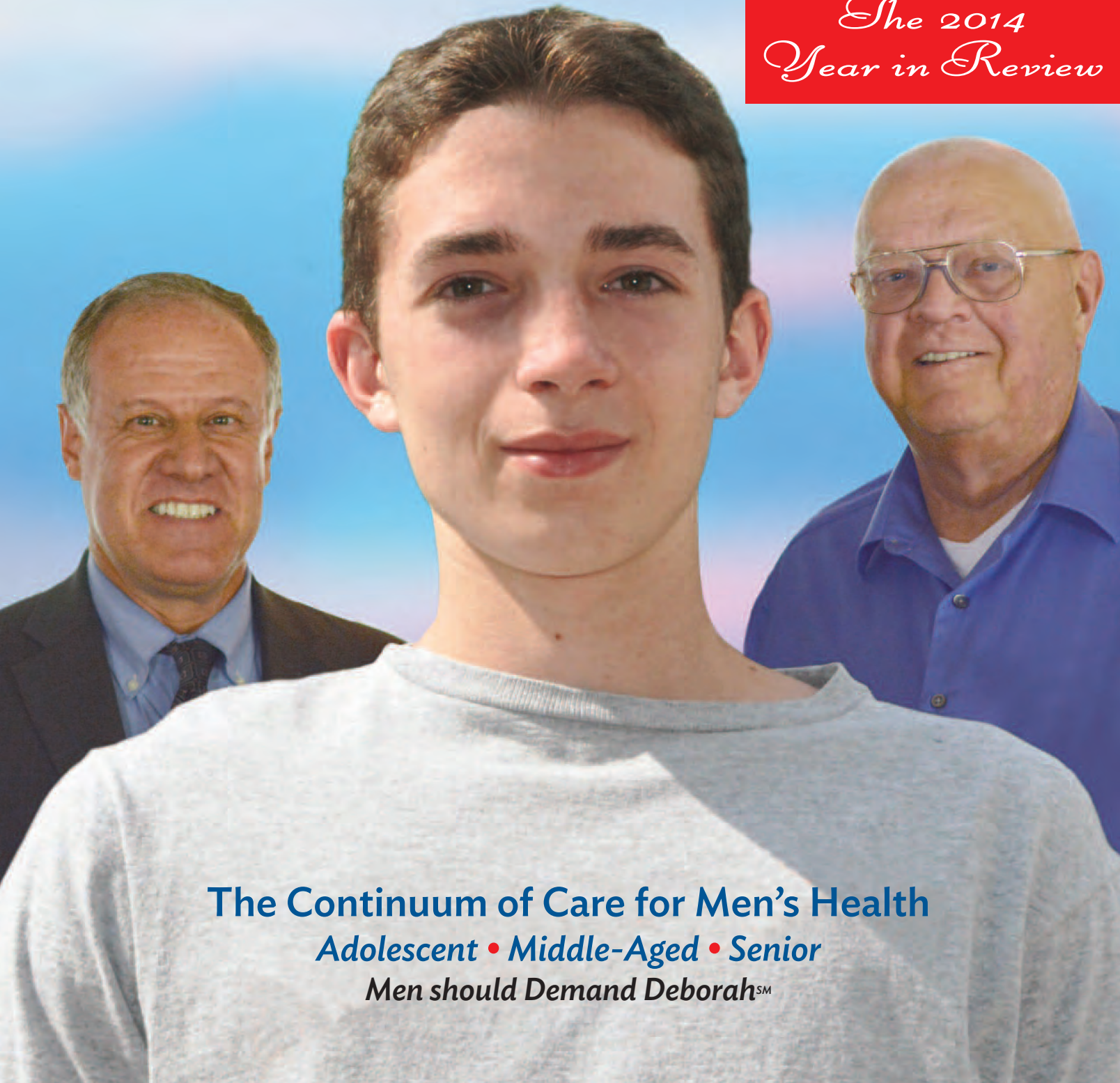

Giving the Gift of Time

There is a special group of people at Deborah Heart and Lung Center who collectively represent the backbone of the entire organization.

These notable people are the compassionate volunteers who each have a unique and personal story about their Deborah experience. These volunteers provide an invaluable service to patients, families, visitors, and staff, making the hospital a brighter place for everyone.

One of these volunteers who works “behind the scenes” -- rather than up front like the more visible “Red Coat” Volunteers -- is Rocco Di Giacomo, who has been a tireless volunteer since 2003. “As a member of the community you should give back and this is a great place to do it,” he explained.

Born and raised in Paterson, NJ, Rocco spent his teenage years shining on the soccer and baseball fields, playing alongside skilled athletes from countries throughout the world. After high school he went on to earn a B.S. in Math Education and an M.S. in Mathematics from Fairleigh Dickinson University. He then went on to a successful teaching career at Rancocas Valley High School where he taught until his retirement in 2003.

Unfortunately, in 1997 Rocco was diagnosed with Atrial Fibrillation (AF) - - a condition that produces irregular and rapid heartbeats. About 40 pounds overweight, Rocco remembers profusely sweating and having trouble breathing while doing simple tasks that did not require a lot of physical exertion. “It was beginning to affect my life at work and at home,” he explained. As a father of three and grandfather to nine, he had a very active life. “My heartbeat had to go back to a normal rhythm.”

He underwent treatment in 1997. Just a few months later his heart went back to its irregular heartbeat. Then Rocco went through multiple cardioversions administered on two separate occasions, but each time the low-energy shocks to his heart turned out to be ineffective. He finally decided to come to Deborah Heart and Lung Center.

“BOOM! The first try and it was back to a regular rhythm and I was fixed for more than five years,” he explained, regarding his first visit to Deborah.

Because of his positive experience at the hospital, Rocco and his friend Gary Frantz -- a colleague and fellow grateful patient at Deborah - - decided in 2003 to begin volunteering at the hospital. “We felt like we owed them for what they did for us; they treated us like family.”

The two have been volunteering in the marketing department ever since.

Rocco and Gary remain optimistic and committed to giving back to the Deborah community. The staff agrees that they have brightened every day they have had the privilege of working with them. Deborah is proud to call both Rocco and Gary “family.”

"I am so thankful for the Deborah Hospital Staff! God Bless Deborah!"

For decades this expression of gratitude has been echoed by our patients, their loved ones and friends. Most recently it was repeated by three men of varying generations: adolescence, middle-aged and senior citizen, whose lives have been altered through interactions with Deborah.

The "LIFE" of a teenager

Brendan is a typical 16 year old teenager--an energetic, physically fit basketball and soccer player with good grades, a bright future and a positive outlook on life. Last September he attended Deborah Heart and Lung Center's Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention Program at Cherokee High School. Deborah, in conjunction with Simon's Fund, offered free, comprehensive cardiac evaluations to all adolescents within the school district. During Brendan's evaluation, Deborah clinicians uncovered a congenital heart abnormality known as "Bicuspid Aortic Valve," which is a defect in the heart's aortic valve.

Most parents never think to have their children's hearts tested because symptoms are rarely present. Unfortunately, as we read all too often, certain undetected cardiac abnormalities can result in Sudden Cardiac Arrest, in most

cases striking down a seemingly perfectly healthy child. Historical data suggests Sudden Cardiac Arrest occurs with one in 200,000 children. However, recent, more accurate studies suggest the incidence may be four or five times greater. Today, these unnecessary deaths and undiagnosed conditions are detectable and preventable with comprehensive heart evaluations. From a parent's perspective, the death of even one child...is too many.

Along with Brendan, more than 250 other students were seen by Deborah's clinical staff. Approximately 10% of the students were then further evaluated with an echocardiogram (ultrasound of the heart). Of this group, 10 students, including Brendan, presented

From a baby to the Boardroom – A lifetime with Deborah

Robert Birnbaum, 51, was born with two holes in his heart – a congenital heart defect which, left untreated, often results in childhood mortality. As a member of the Deborah Foundation's Passaic Chapter, his mother Libby knew of the hospital's extraordinary reputation. Therefore, immediately after leaving the maternity ward, the Birnbaums headed to

Deborah. Through an exploratory procedure, Deborah's pediatric cardiologist determined Robert was not at risk now, but would most likely need open heart surgery within a few years.

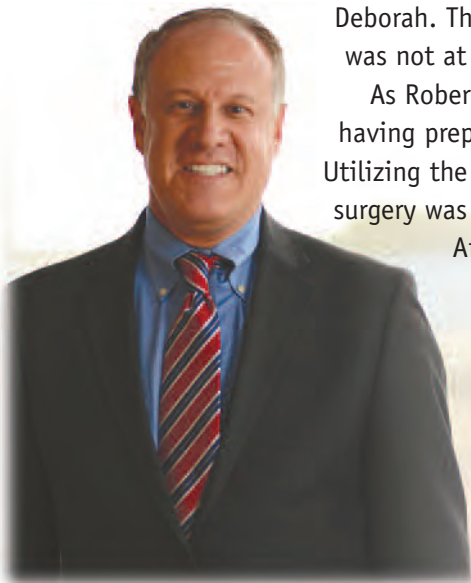
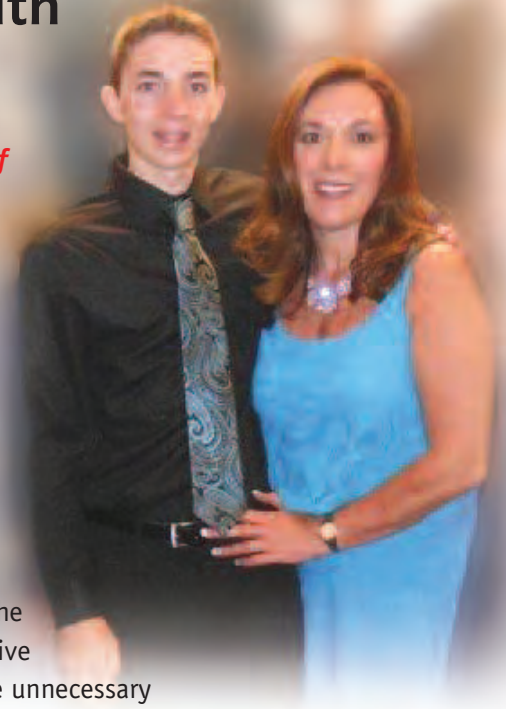
As Robert approached his 4th birthday, he was back at Deborah. His nervous parents, having prepared themselves for the ordeal of their toddler son's surgery, were given a reprieve. Utilizing the state-of-the-art technology available at Deborah, the cardiac team determined his surgery was not needed at that time, sparing both Robert and his parents, pain and worry.

After a week in the hospital, Robert was discharged and brought home.

As young parents, the bills from Robert's care could have financially devastated the family. But, through generous gifts from our donors, the Deborah Foundation assists the hospital in removing the financial burden for all of Deborah's patients. Quite simply, Deborah does not want anyone to make a medical decision based on their personal financial situation.

Over the next 40 years, Robert remained under the watchful care of Deborah's cardiologists. It wasn't until 2008 he finally underwent successful open heart surgery to repair his heart.

significant enough findings for them to be referred to a pediatric cardiologist for a more in-depth evaluation. In Brendan's case, he was seen by his pediatric cardiologist, cleared for all his athletic activities and went on to be named the Offensive MVP for Cherokee High School's junior varsity soccer team.

Brendan's mother Paula states, "Our family is fortunate we decided to participate in Deborah's program and to heed the physician's advice to follow up with a pediatric cardiologist. Brendan is now aware of his condition, but he refuses to let this define him." A junior at Cherokee, he is using his experience to inspire others to get screened. "I hope by sharing my story, more kids will get tested. If just one person gets diagnosed who previously didn't know they had a heart issue, then it was worth sharing this very private matter with the public," Brendan related.

Note: Brendan is looking forward to the upcoming soccer and basketball seasons and fully intends to participate in college athletics once he graduates.

Over his lifetime Robert has given generously of his time and resources to Deborah. In June 2015 Robert was elected as the Chairman of the Foundation Board after serving as Secretary since 2009. As President and Treasurer of the Clifton Chapter, with Life Memberships in the Greater Pompton Area, Clifton and Point Pleasant Chapters he remains an active volunteer and chairs various fundraising activities benefiting the Foundation.

Robert proudly exclaims, "As a professional with an accounting and banking background, I can assist Deborah by seeking out new fundraising opportunities which will help us remain cost-conscious in times of managed care cutbacks. I am truly honored to be affiliated with Deborah and feel my service on the Board of Directors is one way of giving back for the incredible care I've received for more than 40 years."

"Walking into Deborah Heart and Lung Center last week was a much better way to see the place than the way I arrived three years ago!"

As an emergency patient being rushed in on a stretcher, Emory Turnure's heart was failing and he was dying. He remembers the kind face and the reassuring voice of a nurse named Debbie who told him, "I'm going to take good care of you, don't worry." He was then rushed into surgery where Deborah's Cardiac Surgical Team performed successful open heart surgery, saving Emory's life.

Prior to the surgery Emory had a very weak and very inefficient pumping heart. This condition is not only frightening, but also greatly diminishes your quality of life. Since his successful operation and cardiac rehab, Emory continues to see Deborah cardiologists for his follow-up care. His health has greatly improved, his medications are properly balanced and his quality of life has been enhanced dramatically.

Emory, now 75, enjoys and appreciates every opportunity that comes his way. He loves to travel, attend Deborah Foundation lunches, and volunteers to speak as a grateful patient about his experiences at Deborah. He remains a strong advocate for the Foundation and gives of both his time and treasury to support the missions of the Foundation and the hospital. He is a member of the Foundation's Heritage Circle, which is a group of selfless individuals who have generously remembered Deborah Hospital Foundation in their estate plans.

"Today, I feel blessed to be able to visit Deborah and hug ALL the nurses – there were so many who so compassionately cared for me, and helped my family to understand what was happening. I always take the time to tell them how much I appreciate what they did to help me stay positive and focus on the light at the end of the tunnel. They are all like family to me."

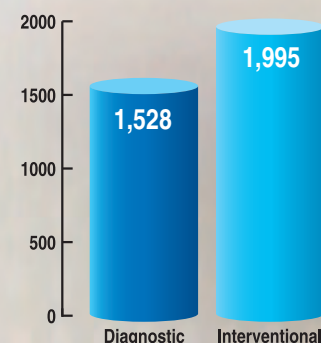
