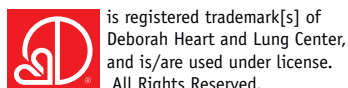

Deborah Offers Follow-up Care to Patients with Left Ventricular Assist Devices

Deborah – long on the forefront of cutting-edge technology – is now a pioneer in providing shared outpatient care to monitor patients who have undergone implantation of left ventricular assist devices (LVADs) at implanting centers in the region.

LVADs are mechanical pumps that support the heart and blood flow in patients with congestive heart failure. Previously used for patients who were facing end-stage heart failure, they are now used more and more in earlier stages of heart failure, offering increased options for patients waiting for a heart transplant, or, even for those who are not transplant candidates. These devices mechanically pump blood from the lower chamber of the heart and send it to the body and vital organs.

Deborah's heart failure cardiologist, Niya Jones, MD, is excited about the new shared outpatient care program.

"Given the high quality of heart failure care we provide, it makes sense for patients with LVADs to come to Deborah for their outpatient follow-up. As one of the few hospitals in South Jersey providing outpatient care for patients with LVADs, we are now able to provide truly comprehensive heart failure care. Shared outpatient care is a win-win for everyone," says Dr. Jones.

Cured... from a Lifetime of Arrhythmias

Maria Jelonek has suffered from a life-long heart rhythm disorder condition since she was 15, No one took her seriously – doctors just told her she was stressed, and not to worry about it.

In 1997, Maria moved to the United States from Poland with her husband and two children – Tom and Violet – to be closer to family. Her health continued to deteriorate.

“Her heart beat kept getting faster and faster,” recalls her daughter Violet. “It kept getting worse until finally the time came when she was watching my daughter Chloe and she fainted. She had a serious problem.”

Maria’s situation worsened with her heart racing from 45-190 beats per minute, compounded by anxiety, since she was afraid to be alone.

“I couldn’t take care of myself. I couldn’t be a grandma,” says Maria. “I went from hospital to hospital,

doctor to doctor. Finally I found a cardiologist who told me I need an ablation (which stops heart rhythm disorders with radiofrequency energy dispensed with a robotic catheter). He recommended Deborah and Dr. Raffaele Corbisiero.”

“I went to the hospital where Dr. Corbisiero, Director of Deborah’s Electromechanical Therapy Institute, performed my ablation. When I woke up after the procedure I looked at the heart monitor. I saw the heartbeat at 75 and thought the monitor was turned off. It was the first time I had seen a regular heartbeat.”


Ever since the procedure Maria has had a new lease on life. She has

energy and vitality that she thought was long gone. No longer afraid of an irregular heartbeat, she has no problem going with Violet and her daughter-in-law Betty – with her grandchildren in tow – to the park to feed the ducks, or run up the stairs to check on them.

“I am so thankful to Deborah and Dr. Corbisiero,” she says. “They have given me a brand-new life.”

Deborah's Pharmacy Welcomes **ReX**

Meet ReX.

A robot affectionately named "ReX" is the centerpiece of a recent Pharmacy Department make-over that offers Deborah a seamless tie-in between nursing, pharmacy, and anesthesia. The PROmanager-RX™ robot has become the Deborah pharmacists' most trusted "right-hand man."

"We went through a two-year planning process before we embarked on this \$2 million project," says Deb Sadowski, RPh, Deborah's Director of Pharmacy Services. "Since ReX came on board in November 2014, we have been nothing but pleased. The project has exceeded our expectations."

ReX is a robotic drug-dispensing system which accurately manages the hospital's vast pharmacy inventory – and high-volume dosing – and is the main component of an integrated suite of pharmacy solutions linked to dispensing and inventory management of all medications. ReX also coordinates with two other key pieces of the system – the AcuDose-RX® automated dispensing cabinets located throughout the floors of the hospital and the Anesthesia-RX™ medication carts central to the hospital's operating and procedural suites. The entire system dispenses medicines based on bar-code technology which reads drug name, National Drug Code identifier, and other pertinent information, including expiration dates.

"All three pieces of the system are networked and communicate with each other," explains Sadowski. "This offers an efficient and virtually error-free environment for pharmaceutical distribution. Overall, the system helps to enhance patient safety by assisting the nurse in confirming the FIVE RIGHTS of medication administration with each dose- right patient, right drug, right dose, right route and right time."

The 24-person pharmacy department worked hard as a team during ReX's installation and implementation phases.

"This project was a monumental task, but my staff was up to the challenge!" adds Sadowski. "Not once during this implementation process was service or patient care interrupted. The staff came in over a weekend and moved the entire Pharmacy to the break room and worked in space that was less than half the size of the regular pharmacy while the remodeling went on. Then they did the same thing in reverse when it was time to move back into our newly remodeled space with ReX. The whole

project team and staff worked really hard together and did a fantastic job. This project was their vision."

A sophisticated pharmacy automation system like this is still fairly uncommon in hospitals of Deborah's size, but Sadowski notes that Deborah is anything but usual in this regard.

"Although we are a smaller hospital, by the very nature of what we do here – complex heart, lung and vascular procedures – we have a pharmaceutical volume comparable with community hospitals three times our size. Bottom line is: We use a lot of medicine here. ReX makes the process of getting that medicine to our patients much smoother."

"In addition to excellent inventory management and nearly perfect accuracy, ReX will enable us to free up pharmacist time from dispensing functions to focus on the more clinical aspects of their profession related to patient care."

"We really do feel like our new robot friend is a part of our team."

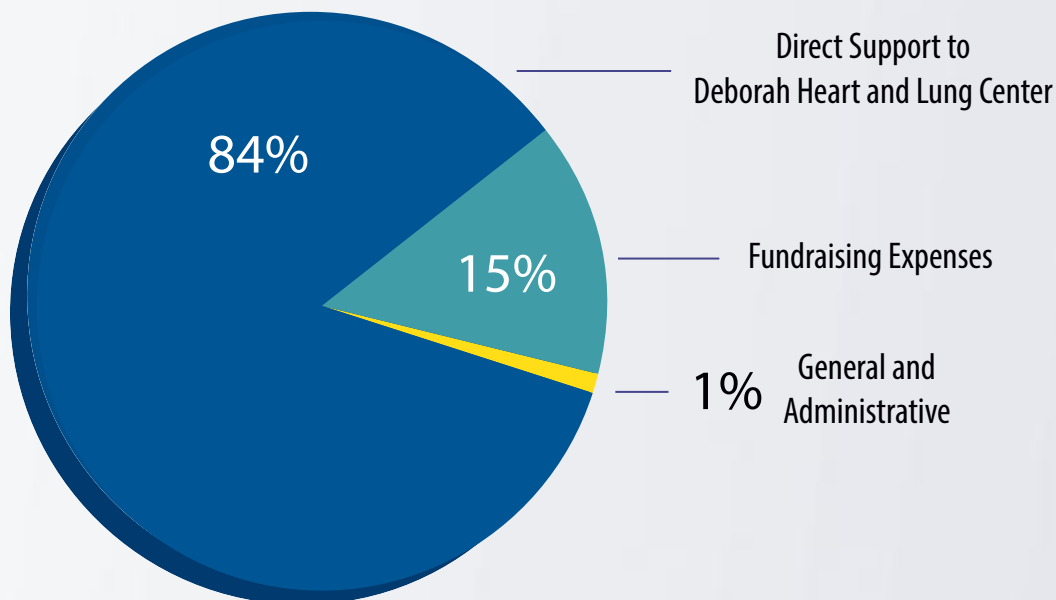

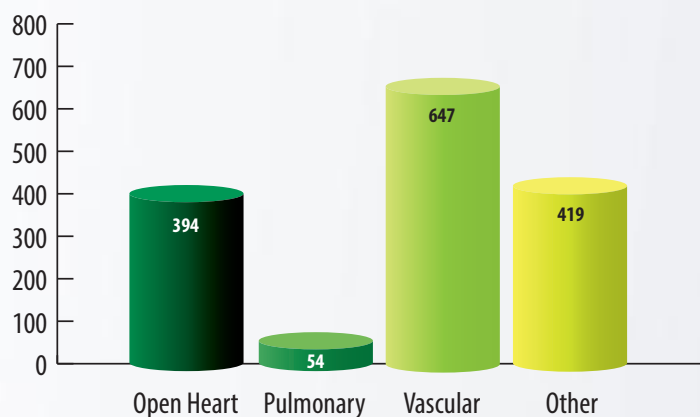

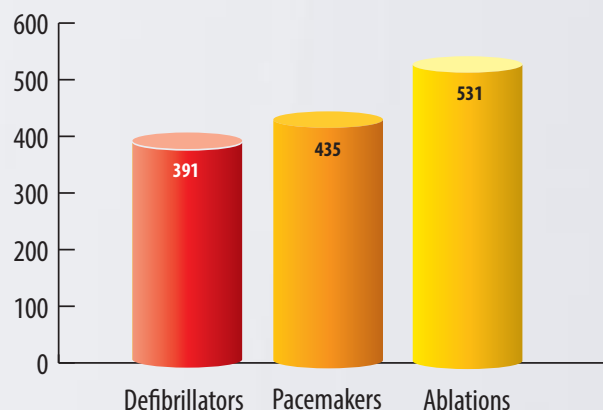

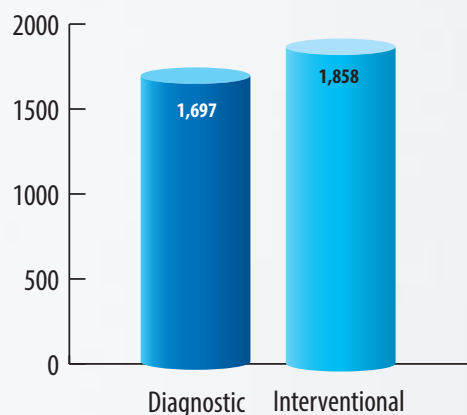

Being Remembered for the Right Reasons

How do you want to be remembered? Benjamin Franklin is remembered for being inventive, enlightened and forward-thinking. Rosa Parks is remembered as someone who fought for civil rights. Babe Ruth is remembered as a baseball legend. Elizabeth Taylor is remembered as a beauty and an activist.

Joan Marchese wants to be remembered, very simply, as someone who cared.

At the age of 75, Joan lives a fairly uneventful life in Haddon Township, NJ; yet, several years ago, she made a decision that will help save lives years from now, and will create a legacy of hope and caring at Deborah.

In 1970, Joan was living with her mother Helen and working in Camden. Her younger brother Joseph was in college at The University of Vanderbilt, hoping to continue on to medical school. Unexpectedly, he contracted a blood disease, and, after several hospitalizations, died at the age of 22. To this day, Joan believes that if Joe would have been treated at Deborah, he would still be in her life.

After Joe's passing, the bond between Joan and her mother grew even stronger – until Helen's death 33 years later.

Joan remembers her mother as someone who took good care of her and Joe, teaching them to be independent and to help others. As the sole survivor of the family, Joan received Helen's entire estate.

Since Joan is single and does not have children, she knows that, without a will, the government would receive her assets, so she had a will prepared several years ago. With the additional money from her mother's estate, Joan called her attorney and CPA to help update her will, so that she could help others.

Just by coincidence, she had seen a Deborah commercial around the same time, so she asked her CPA to do some research on the hospital. When they got together to update her will, she had no doubt in her mind that she wanted to add Deborah Hospital Foundation.

It makes Joan feel good every day, knowing that a decision she has made during her life will matter to others after she passes.

Once she informed the Foundation of her intentions, she started receiving *Inside Deborah* and invitations to special events. As she learned more about Deborah's life-saving work and our current needs, Joan also decided to help Deborah today, making generous outright donations every year.

"I just want to be remembered as someone who cared," Joan remarks when asked about her legacy.

The IRA Rollover - An Easy Gift Option

Permanent law offers benefits to give from your IRA

For the past few years, Congress has waited until the end of the year to pass a bill allowing individuals who are 70½ or older to make charitable contributions directly from their Individual Retirement Account (IRA) or Roth IRA. For many of our donors who qualify for this rollover, the decision has come too late in the year for them to act. However, thanks to new legislation passed in December 2015, **the IRA rollover gift option has become permanent.**

If you are 70½ or older, you can make a gift to Deborah Hospital Foundation directly from your individual retirement account (IRA) or Roth IRA and have it **count toward your annual minimum required distribution (MRD), and not subject your Social Security income to higher tax levels.**

The new law allows you to give up to \$100,000 per IRA owner, meaning a husband and wife with separate IRAs could give up to \$200,000 per year.

Since rollover gifts from your IRA will not be recognized as taxable income to you, no additional charitable deduction is given.

Please contact us when you direct a rollover so we can look for the check from your plan provider. We will provide you with a prompt written substantiation of your IRA rollover contribution.

An IRA must be an outright gift; it cannot be used to establish a charitable gift annuity or a charitable remainder trust. Checks must be made payable directly by your IRA custodian to:

Can I still make a non-rollover gift from my IRA?

Yes, you can take your IRA distribution, recognize it as taxable income, and then make a charitable donation from it to Deborah Hospital Foundation. As with all charitable gifts, you will receive a dollar-for-dollar deduction for your donation.

Can I still make an IRA beneficiary designation?

Whether or not you choose to make a charitable IRA rollover gift in 2016, or in the years to come, you can still designate Deborah Hospital Foundation as a first, second, or contingent beneficiary of your IRA assets after your lifetime.

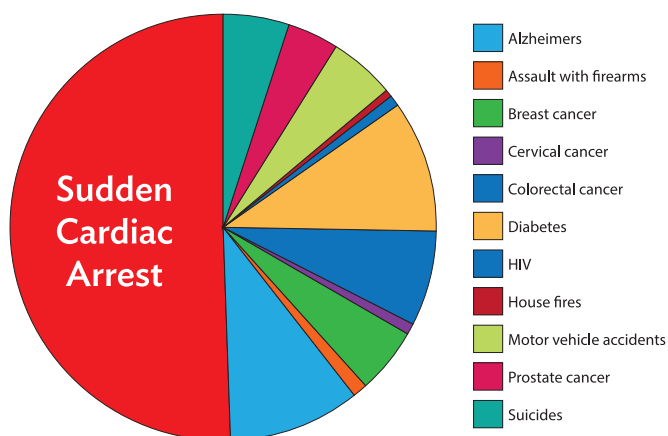
Central Regional High School Hosts: “Love Your Heart” - Sudden Cardiac Arrest Program



On Saturday, October 24, 2015, Deborah's Community Outreach Department successfully partnered with The Central Regional School District in Bayville, NJ and conducted free cardiac screenings for students, ages 12-19 years old. The screening is designed to identify a previously undetected/diagnosed heart abnormality. Sudden Cardiac Arrest is not a heart attack...it is more serious. SCA causes all life functions to stop immediately and if life-saving treatment (CPR and/or use of automated external defibrillators [AEDs]) aren't immediately administered, the likely outcome is death. No symptoms are usually felt until it is too late.

Sudden Cardiac Arrest is the #1 cause of death in the U.S.A.
