She smiled and asked if I would like a tour of the hospital. As we walked through the hospital, it all became very clear. I finally understood what mom-mom meant when she said, "I work for this very special place".

So, why is it so special? First, the philosophy of Deborah Hospital Foundation..."there is no price on life." Which means, there is no out-of-pocket expense to the patient for care they receive in the Center—that expense is covered by the Foundation. In today's world this is an extraordinary feat. Second, the Deborah staff. I am always amazed when I ask an employee, "how long have you been working here?" The response is anywhere from 5 to 40 years. Third, the attitude of the staff. Often, in healthcare environments, the staff feels frustrated and unappreciated, but not at Deborah.



Deborah's new MRI scanner...a life saver!

In an era marked by unprecedented medical advancements,

Deborah Heart and Lung Center stands at the forefront of innovation
with its latest acquisition: a state-of-the-art MRI scanner. Within
its first day on campus it was used to diagnosis a life-threatening
medical condition.

ur very first MRI patient came from the emergency room and presented with acute chest pain," recalled Dr. Chunguang Chen, who oversees the MRI's operation. "She did not have the typical heart attack with a coronary artery blockage, so we needed the cardiac MRI for further diagnosis. Once she was scanned, it was clear that she had suffered a fairly significant cardiac event with an inflammatory attack of the heart muscle (myocarditis), and needed additional intervention."

The acquisition of the MRI scanner stands as an example of effective collaboration between various stakeholders. It took coordination among Deborah Hospital Foundation, the medical staff, as well as members of the U.S. Congress and Senate to secure the \$1 million Community Project Funding/Congressionally Directed Spending Grant to help defray the cost of purchasing and installing the crucial equipment. "Deborah's new MRI scanner will make cardiovascular monitoring more accessible to South Jersey families, continuing the Center's century-long tradition of delivering high-quality heart, lung, and vascular care in a medically underserved area. I will continue to fight for projects like this that keep New Jersey families healthy and safe," stated Senator Cory Booker. This effort underscores the importance of

healthcare innovation, public and private sector partnerships, and the role that cutting-edge technology plays in improving patient outcomes.

This remarkable addition to the Center's technological repertoire not only underscores Deborah's commitment to exceptional patient care, but also heralds a new era in diagnostic imaging. This state-of-the-art device boasts advancements in technology that enable more precise imaging, reduced scan times, and an overall enhanced patient experience. "The new machine is equipped with innovative features like high-resolution imaging, advanced tissue differentiation, and specialized cardiac and pulmonary imaging protocols, which empowers our medical team to make quicker and more accurate diagnoses and leads to significant improvements in the selection of management and therapeutic options and potential outcomes," said Dr. Chen.

In a world where medical technology evolves at an astonishing pace, Deborah Heart and Lung Center stands as a beacon of progress. The acquisition of the MRI scanner underscores the Center's dedication to pushing boundaries and delivering unparalleled patient care. It has been eighteen months since we broke ground on the biggest building project at Deborah Heart and Lung Center in the last forty years. Now with a realistic completion date of December 2023 in reach, excitement on the campus is ramping up.

eborah100:The Project, is destined to become an innovative structure that will act as a model for other healthcare facilities to follow.

As the outside of the building is enclosed, our focus now turns to incorporating the final touches within each of the 36 private patient suites. Our philosophy revolves around fostering innovation and technology while keeping our patients' comfort, safety, and privacy as top priorities during their stay. By creating an environment filled with modern conveniences, an abundance of natural light, and carefully selected colors and textures, we are able to reduce the stress and anxiety of our patients and guests, while enhancing their overall experience.



Our design process has been meticulously structured with our patients in mind. We have even established decentralized workstations, allowing our clinical staff to work in closer proximity with our patients. This means more personalized care for each patient we serve.

We recognize how physically and emotionally draining it can be for our patients and their families; the same holds true for our Deborah team members. Within our design, we've included a comfortable lounge with an outside patio, providing space for them to take a few minutes to recharge their own batteries, so they return refreshed to provide the exceptional, compassionate care customary at Deborah.

In keeping with Deborah's stress-free initiative, we have integrated an external five-story living wall into our construction process, featuring an array of flowers and plants that will produce an evolving mosaic of beauty and color during all four seasons. The living wall symbolizes Deborah's perpetual growth and innovation, mirroring the ever-changing nature of the plants. It will serve as a vibrant centerpiece and as a source of inspiration and comfort for those who visit our campus.

Students at Lindenwold Elementary School No. 4 donate \$1,000 worth of change to Deborah!

n a heartwarming display of community spirit and generosity, the National Honor Society (NHS) students at Lindenwold Elementary School 4 (LES4) banded together to make a remarkable contribution to Deborah. During their "Everyone's Two Cents Counts" fund drive, these young scholars collected and turned loose change, and some bills, into an astonishing \$1,000 check to Deborah Hospital Foundation.

Led by teachers Suzanne Tichy and George Bosco, the students at LES4 demonstrated that age is no barrier to making a significant impact on the world around them. The children's selfless acts of donating to Deborah is a testament to their compassion and desire to create positive change. Mrs. Tichy remarked, "We started with a goal of raising \$500, but after the first day of collecting coins, two of the kids baskets broke from the weight of the coins. It was then the kids decided – let's go for a thousand dollars!"

The act of collecting coins might seem simple, but the impact of this endeavor goes far beyond its outward appearance. Six fourth grade NHS students spent weeks coordinating the collection effort, reaching out to fellow students, teachers, families and community members. "They asked their parents, grandparents, neighbors and even looked under couch cushions and car seats – just anywhere they could look they found coins – lots of them!" said Mr. Bosco.

The choice to donate to Deborah holds a special significance. From its inception in 1922, Deborah has benefited from this type of grassroots fundraising through the 1980's when over 80,000 Deborah volunteers routinely collected change outside of retail stores up and down the east coast. Through this donation, the students at LES4 learned valuable life lessons such as teamwork, while creating a sense of camaraderie with fellow schoolmates.

This initiative not only raised funds for Deborah, but also fostered a sense of unity and purpose among the entire school. "The class from each grade level who raised the most was awarded with popcorn and a movie," recalled Tichy.

Donating coins took on a symbolic meaning, but it also translated into concrete advantages for the kids. Every coin, regardless of its value, symbolized a fractional part of the community's joint exertion and compassion. The student's commitment to gathering coins demonstrated their awareness that even apparently minor contributions could turn into a substantial, positive impact on their own lives.

This heartening story serves as a reminder that generosity and compassion know no bounds. It's a testament to the power of young minds coming together with a shared purpose, showcasing that even the smallest actions can create a ripple effect of positive change. 


The Foundation adds two



ven the strongest families are tested by life's most difficult moments, and often need support outside the family to help get through and manage the situation. At age 43, Peter Meyer, suffered a heart attack and was ultimately brought to Deborah where he underwent successful triple bypass surgery. From that moment, Lori, his 7 year old daughter learned just how big a role Deborah Heart and Lung Center (Deborah) would play to keep her family together.

Peter and his family were beneficiaries of Deborah's specialized medical expertise as well as its altruistic billing philosophy. Thanks to the Deborah Hospital Foundation, there was no out of pocket expense for Peter's surgery or decades of continued care. Depending on insurance coverage, the cost to a patient for that type of surgery would have bankrupted the family. Lori, now mother of two, explained had it not been for Deborah's Foundation support her father would not have had the surgery and would have missed out on years of birthdays, holidays, and scores of family memories and milestones.

"He never stopped talking about Deborah and how profoundly it had impacted him. He made it his mission to give back whenever he could, even up until his recent passing at 86 years old," Lori conveyed.

"There are so many cherished memories. I had the privilege of sharing different stages of my life with him. As a child, I frequently accompanied him to work

where he managed a bowling alley, and I eagerly helped out in any way I could. That was truly special, it was there my dad taught me how to bowl, a skill I've since passed down to my own children," Lori reflected.

Peter credits Deborah with an extra 43 years, allowing him the opportunity to be present to watch his little girl grow up, go to college, get married, get her master's degree and above all, become a mom making him a grandfather with two grandsons.

"When I began graduate school in May 2020, he was there, cheering me on, always inquiring about my progress, and expressing his pride in my decision to embark on such a significant life endeavor while raising a family. It was bittersweet for me when he passed away just weeks after my graduation. I have no doubt he held on until after I graduated," said Lori.

Deborah provided Peter with a second chance at life and he made the most of it. Before his passing he wrote a letter to Deborah expressing his appreciation for extending his life.

Peter often shared his thoughts about Deborah with the noble intention of informing and reassuring other families facing similar health and financial challenges. In his final heartfelt act, Peter modified his will adding a planned gift to Deborah Hospital Foundation, to ensure other patients will have the same opportunity he was afforded while keeping their families intact to experience all of life's special moments and milestones together.
