Upon completion, they delivered the incredible news that my procedure was a success. Dr. Kovach even took the time to speak with Linda, explaining everything and offering her comfort.

Deborah is a truly special place, filled with dedicated professionals who go above and beyond to ensure the well-being of their patients. I am honored and privileged to serve as the Foundation Chair, and I wish everyone good health and happiness in the coming year.

## Joseph Chirichella: 2024 Red Tie Gala honoree

**Joseph Chirichella, President Emeritus of Deborah Heart and Lung Center and Deborah Hospital Foundation, was honored at the 2024 Red Tie Gala for his nearly 50-year career of leadership, dedication, and commitment to quality patient care.**

Joseph Chirichella's journey at Deborah began 46 years ago as an administrative intern. Over the decades, he served in numerous roles including Director of Materials Management, Assistant Administrator, Vice-President of Operations, and eventually President and CEO. His leadership and forward-thinking ideas helped shape the future of Deborah, but Joe consistently credits the success of these initiatives to the teams he worked with.

During his tenure, Joe's vision contributed to the expansion of Deborah's campus, which included the construction of a Medical Office Building housing community-based services such as urgent care, pharmacy, and various provider offices. He also oversaw a \$108 million expansion of the hospital, introducing state-of-the-art critical care rooms and a respite space for staff – improvements driven by his desire to create an environment focused on the well-being of both patients and employees.

Collaboration and partnership have been key themes throughout Joe's career. Under his guidance, Deborah formed an alliance with Cleveland Clinic's Heart, Vascular & Thoracic Institute, one of the nation's leading heart care institutions. Joe also played a pivotal role in developing the HeroCare Connect™ program in partnership with Cooper University Health Care, providing healthcare navigation for active-duty military personnel, veterans, and their families. His leadership helped bring emergency services to Deborah's campus, ensuring a broader scope of care for the local community.

Joe's approach has always been grounded in humility. He provided the vision and direction, but he has always been quick to highlight the dedication and expertise of the teams that brought those ideas to life. Throughout his career, he remained focused on fulfilling Deborah's mission of delivering top-tier heart, lung, and vascular care to all, regardless of their ability to pay.

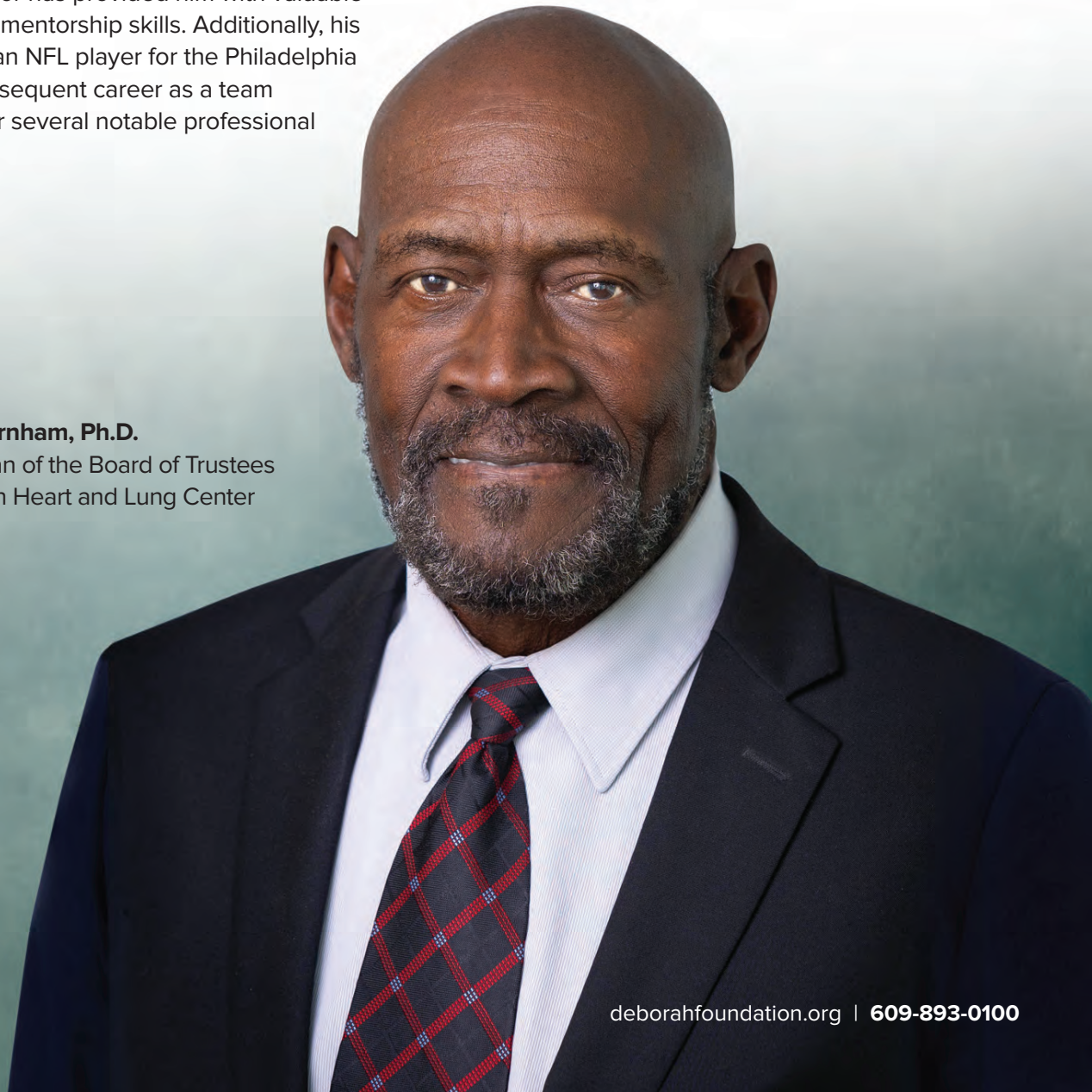
sports teams, has instilled in him a strong understanding of high-performance environments and the importance of mental well-being.

# Deborah hosts the Future Phy

## Offering middle school students a peek “behind the scenes” at the hospital

**D**eborah Heart and Lung Center recently welcomed a dozen middle school students from the Pemberton Township Future Physician’s Enrichment Program.

The students – who participated in a six-week after-school program hosted by The Center for Youth Outreach in Pemberton Borough – used Deborah as a celebratory endcap to the program.

The Future Physicians’ Enrichment Program is designed to engage middle school students, into considering enrollment in the school district’s Medical Arts Academy, with an eye towards a career in medicine.

Deborah’s team featured seven presenters from various hospital departments, including administration, cardiac rehab, pharmacy, nursing, and respiratory care. They covered a broad range of topics, offering insights into the hospital’s behind-the-scenes operations, the unique role of a hospital pharmacy compared to a local drug store, and the responsibilities and certifications across different roles. Students were actively engaged, asking pointed questions about education requirements, salary expectations, and work-life balance.

The Center for Youth Outreach Director, Jasmine Poole said: “I am so happy to have the kids here today to see that there are so many career opportunities that don’t necessarily require an advanced degree. I want them to know that there are good-paying jobs and at a hospital that

is right here in their own town. This is a great chance for them to interact with the staff here.”

Two high points of the event included Poole surprising LaQuan Sheffield Washington with recognition of his hard work during a white coat ceremony, in which Deborah President and CEO (Emeritus) Joseph Chirichella assisted.

“LaQuan, who is a student at Pemberton Township’s Helen A. Fort Middle School, was named Future Physician of the Year. This accolade highlights his exceptional dedication and hard work, both in the classroom and during hands-on clinical practices. LaQuan’s ability to effectively apply six weeks of acquired knowledge in practical settings showcases his commitment to the field. With aspirations of becoming a future cardiologist, LaQuan’s achievements underscore his passion and potential in the medical profession,” said Poole.

The second high point was Deborah’s nursing team hosting a hands-on non-invasive blood pressure and pulse oximetry mini teaching clinic with the students.

“This is a great opportunity to help nurture the next generation of medical professionals,” said Deborah’s Director of Volunteer Services, Cyndy Kornfeld, LPN. “This program matches Deborah’s vision of promoting itself as a center of educational excellence as well as a robust community partner. We are so proud to have hosted the students here today.”

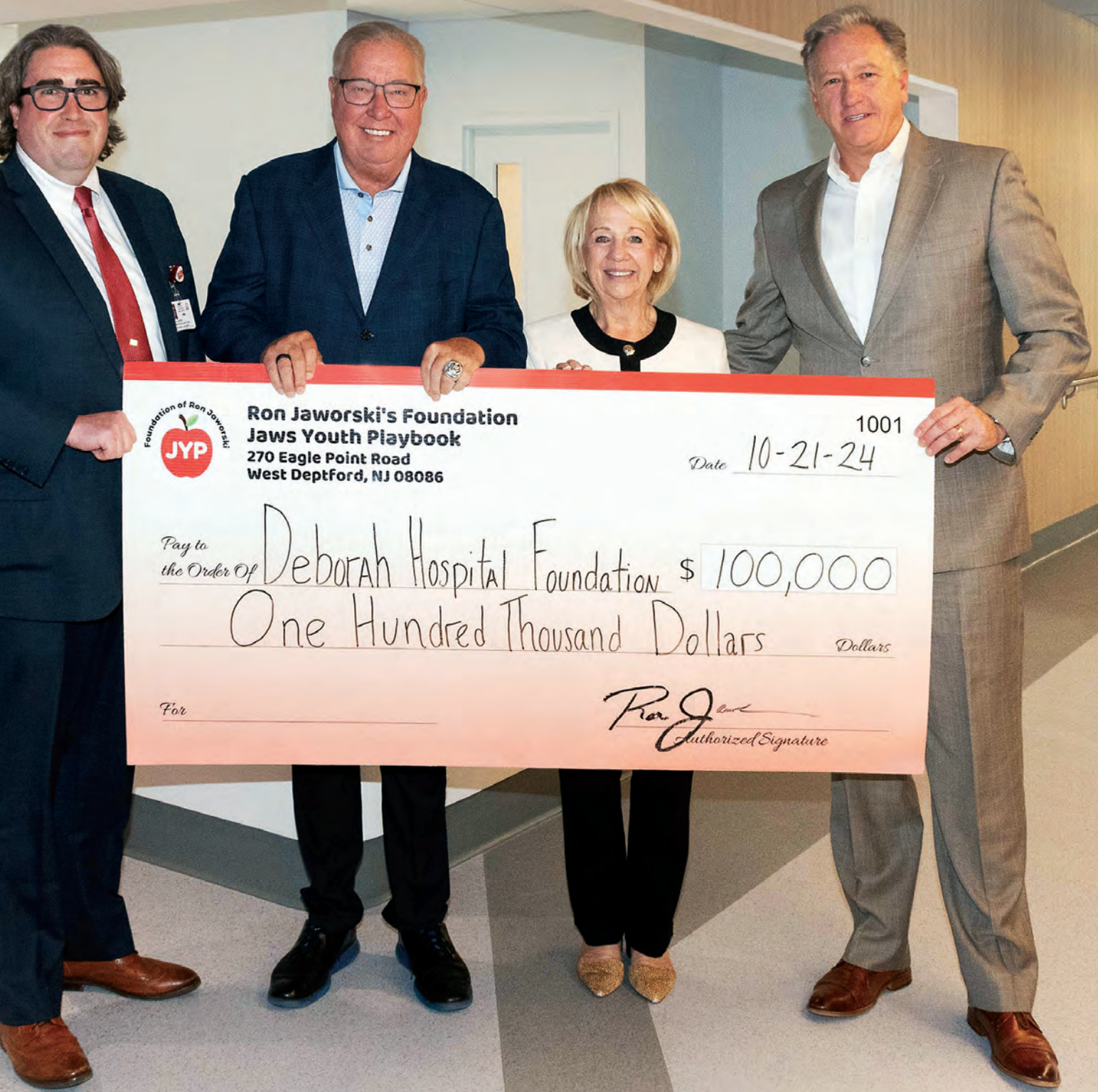

# A patient's journey from heart surgery to *heartfelt* advocacy

Linda Minnella's life was a ballet of strength and resilience, marked by a grand pirouette when fate unexpectedly threw her off balance. As a vibrant, 50-year-old dance instructor, her world was a harmonious blend of movement and melody. Yet, a seemingly innocuous discomfort during a routine workout shattered this idyllic rhythm.

The diagnosis was a shockwave that reverberated through her life: a 100% blockage of her left anterior artery demanded immediate surgical intervention. As a single mother of four, the weight of this news was compounded by the uncertainty of medical bills. But Deborah Hospital Foundation, which supports Deborah Heart and Lung Center, with its compassionate non-billing policy, became her unexpected savior, offering a lifeline amidst the storm.

Surgery was a curtain call, and recovery, a demanding encore. With the tenacity of a seasoned dancer, Linda defied the odds, returning to the stage of life, teaching tap just six weeks post-operation. Her experience at Deborah ignited a flame of gratitude, transforming her into a beacon of hope for fellow heart patients. As a volunteer with the Zipper Club,

she shared her story, offering solace and strength to those navigating the same challenging path.

Beyond her role as a comforter, Linda became a champion for Deborah. She orchestrated fundraising events, her energy as infectious as the rhythm of her tap shoes. Her generosity extended beyond monetary contributions; she became a living testament to the hospital's care, inspiring others through her unwavering spirit. A turning point arrived when Linda learned about creating a lasting legacy through estate planning. Without hesitation, she included Deborah Hospital Foundation as a beneficiary in her will, solidifying her status in the Heritage Circle Society and her commitment to the institution that had given her a second chance.

Today, Linda's life is a beautiful blend of health and philanthropy. She continues to inspire, to teach, and to give back. ## A chillingly good tale

Philanthropy often manifests in traditional forms: monetary donations, volunteer hours, or event driven fundraisers. But sometimes, the most impactful giving emerges from unexpected sources. Such is the case with brothers Chris and Greg Cuneo, whose unique philanthropic journey is as captivating as a classic horror film.

Their shared love for the macabre began innocently. Chris recalls, “My grandma would babysit me, and we’d bond over shows like *Scooby-Doo* and *Casper the Friendly Ghost*. It ignited a spark of fascination.” For Greg, the horror genre took hold with the cinematic thrill of the original *Gremlins*.

From this shared passion emerged a desire to make a difference in people’s lives. “We wanted to create a lasting impact,” Chris explains. “Inspired by two horror icons, George Romero and Alice Cooper – both born on February 4th, which also happens to be during Heart Month – we initially launched *I Heart Horror Day* as a registered holiday. In remembrance of George Romero, whose battle with lung disease made Deborah’s mission particularly poignant, we decided to create a fundraising event.”

This unconventional approach to philanthropy was born from a desire to challenge norms. “We aimed to transform our love of the horror genre into a force for good,” Greg says. By rallying friends, family, and the community, they transformed their eerie fascination into a powerful platform for positive change.

The brothers’ entrepreneurial spirit was essential to their success. “Chris’s outgoing nature and our involvement in conventions and community groups were instrumental,” Greg shares. “People embraced our idea of turning a perceived negative into a powerful force for good.”

Despite initial financial constraints, their determination and community support brought their vision to life. “Starting from scratch, we’ve grown *I Heart Horror Day* into a meaningful event,” says Greg. “Knowing we’re helping cardiac, pulmonary, and vascular patients is incredibly rewarding.”

The third annual *I Heart Horror Day* event will be held on February 1, 2025, at Sayreville Senior Citizen Center located at 423 Main St. Sayreville, NJ 08872. Chris and Greg’s goal is to double this year’s fundraising total of \$8,610, with all event proceeds going to treat Deborah’s patients.

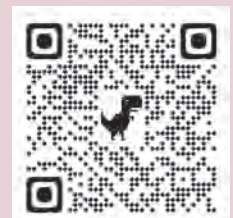
